Malaysia, made up of the Malay Peninsula (West Malaysia) and the northern part of Borneo (East Malaysia), is located in the heart of Southeast Asia, approx. 7 hours by plane from Japan.

With a total population of 32.7 million, Malaysia takes pride in its diversity, with various ethnic groups such as Malays, Chinese, Indians, and other indigenous groups living side by side.

In contrast to the skyscrapers lining up in the capital city, Kuala Lumpur, approximately 60% of the country is covered with tropical rainforest. Blessed with majestic mountains and islands boasting white-sand beaches with clear blue sea, Malaysia's beautiful nature is one of the reasons why it was selected as the "No.1 Country to Live in"* by the Japanese people for 14 consecutive years since 2006!

What is the Look East Policy?

The Look East Policy, implemented in 1982, was the brainchild of former Prime Minister of Malaysia, Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad.

Based on the idea that Japanese work ethics, learning and working desire, morale, and management capability are the key to Japan's success, this policy was introduced with aims to develop Malaysia's socio-economy by learning these traits from Japan.

Since its inception 40 years ago, more than 26,000 Malaysians have been dispatched under this policy to Japanese universities, National Institute of Technology (KOSEN), private companies, local governments, and Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).
