# What's GGP?

**GGP** (**G**rant Assistance for **G**rass-roots Human Security **P**rojects) **is** . . .



**A financial assistance scheme** which supports the following projects proposed by such bodies as **non-profit organizations and local governments**.

- 1. Projects for socio-economic development such as primary health care, public welfare, environment, etc.**
- 2. Projects to improve the well-being of those at grass-roots level**
- 3. Small Projects (under 10mil yen (≐ RM330,000))**

( \* Generally, the GGP supports the Hard Component (for example construction of building and purchase of equipment) of the project. However the Soft Component (for example expense of seminar) can be supported by GGP if it fulfills the important aspect of human capacity building. )

# ***GGP in Malaysia***

**Japan has supported Malaysia through the GGP since 1989**



**Number of projects under GGP : 160 projects**

# Some Examples of GGP in Malaysia

## 2014 : The Project for Enhancing the Capability to Collect Recycling Items by the Handicapped People

(Recipient) Beautiful Gate Foundation for the Disabled (Amount) RM 324,804



### (Summary)

The project will enable the NGO to purchase and set up 180 recycling bins and to purchase a truck to increase employment opportunities in the recycling industry, and to facilitate vocational training on separation of recycled items as well as support activities for the disabled by enhancing the efficiency of garbage collection.

### (Cooperation with Japanese Company)

This project is a public-private partnership between the Government of Japan and OJI Paper Group of Japan and its subsidiary GS Paper and Packaging. GS Paper will purchase the recycled paper collected by the NGO. The company will also advise the NGO on efficient collection and recycling activities and provide training.

## 2014 : The Project for Installing the Vehicles for Wheel Chair Users

(Recipient) Persatuan Mobiliti Selangor dan Kuala Lumpur (Mobiliti) (Amount) RM 234,119



### (Summary)

Persatuan Mobiliti Selangor dan Kuala Lumpur (Mobiliti) is an NGO which provides Taxi service to wheel chair users at very low fares. Mobiliti will utilize the grant to purchase two vans with wheel chair lifts to transport people with disabilities. The GGP was also provided to Mobiliti in 2008 to purchase a van with wheelchair lift.

*\*Except Federal government authorities and Japanese NGOs*

*\*Except NGOs less than two years of establishment*

- ✓ ***Researches (except the project that is clearly for grass-roots activities)***

## **Required documentation:**

- ✓ A detailed budget for the project  
    [ particularly, the objectives, socio-economic impact,  
    and cost of overall project and financing ]
- ✓ A map showing the project site
- ✓ A feasibility study for the project
- ✓ Estimates from three different suppliers
- ✓ Outside auditing capacity
- ✓ A brochure and a copy of regulations, and  
    the annual budget of your organization
